# **Stanley Robert Jones by Tim Jones**

We have just been to Sheffield visit a new exhibition at the Graves gallery featuring two of my late fathers Lino cut prints. The exhibition is titled "Place and Identity" and runs until April next year. Dad's prints are in prestigious company – next to an L S Lowry and close to pictures by Cezanne, Turner, Constable amongst others.

My father, Stanley Robert Jones, trained at Birmingham College of art and then the Royal Academy schools in London and went on to teach print making at Sheffield College of Art. Sue Pashley was one of his students! When he lived in London he had one of his paintings selected for the 1953 Football and the Fine Arts exhibition which was won by LS Lowrys' Going to the Match painting, so he has shared exhibition space with Lowry in the past.

Sheffield Museums already have two of my fathers paintings in their collection and recently I've had a series of meetings with the museum for them to select other works to add to their collection. It came as a wonderful surprise this week to be told that two of his prints had been selected for the new exhibition.

I was always drawing as a kid, always seemed to have a pencil and a piece of paper in my hand. Unfortunately I was not able to go on to study art after 16 due to family circumstances. I had a short stint at evening class when the children were small but then I was back into the world of work. When my first marriage broke down I did an Open University degree but they don't do art unfortunately. Mick (my second husband) and I retired to Cyprus in 2004 and I made sure I signed on for art lessons. First in acrylics and then with a lovely lady who taught



watercolour. When we came back after eleven years we lived in Bridlington for six years and I joined art clubs there.
